Connections to Train Services

Train line	Route		
Joondalup	Take the train to Stirling Station, then catch the Circle Route bus (No. 999, and No. 998 to return).		
Midland & Armadale/Thornlie	Take a train into Perth Station, then travel out on the Fremantle line, or disembark at Perth Station and take bus No. 950 from Wellington Street.		
Fremantle	Travel through to Subiaco Station and catch the Subiaco Shuttle (No. 97), or through to Shenton Park Station to connect to the Circle Route (No. 999, and No. 998 to return).		
Mandurah	Take a train to Elizabeth Quay Station, then catch bus No. 950 from the Elizabeth Quay Bus Station.
