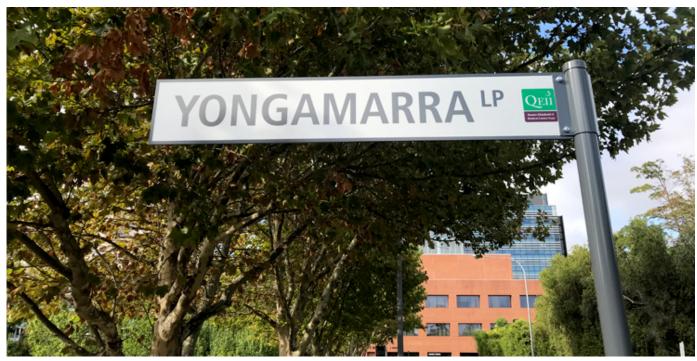

New Noongar Street Names for the QEIIMC

You may have seen some new street signs popping up around campus! The QEIIMC Trust, in collaboration with the South West Aboriginal Land and Sea Council Whadjuk Working Group, have chosen Noongar names for a number of previously unnamed roads on campus.

The aim of this project was to improve wayfinding at QEIIMC and celebrate the Aboriginal culture of our local area. Some of the new Noongar street names include:

- Marlee Loop which is a Noongar word meaning 'black swan'.
- Wonil Way pronounced wun-ill, which is a Noongar word meaning 'peppermint tree'.
- Yongamarra Loop which is a Noongar word meaning kangaroo paw.

The QEIIMC Trust acknowledges the Traditional Owners of the land, the Whadjuk people of the Noongar nation, and pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging.

The Kids' Bridge - Kulunga Bridge

Thank you for your patience as work on the new Kids' Bridge continues.

When complete, this bridge will connect the greenspace north of Perth Children's Hospital with Kings Park and give patients, visitors and staff at QEIIMC a direct link to our native bushland.

It is anticipated The Kids' Bridge will improve the health and wellbeing of our campus users. We are advised that our patients, especially young patients at PCH, will benefit with the opportunity for some types of medical therapies to take place outside.

As painting, welding and concrete works continue, there will be lane closures and reduced speed limits in place on Winthrop Avenue, outside of peak traffic times. Please follow all signs including speed limits.

Pedestrian and cyclist detours are also in place: please obey the closure and detour signs for your safety.
